

Respect in Sport Policy

Adopted by Board of Directors March 20, 2023

Purpose of the Policy:

- 1. Triathlon Manitoba is committed to creating a sport environment in which all individuals are treated with respect and dignity. Coaches have a responsibility to create a sporting environment that is free of harassment and abuse.
- 2. Triathlon Manitoba requires that all coaches participating in Triathlon Manitoba sanctioned events complete the Respect in Sport (RIS) program and maintain RIS certified status (5-year term) as required by Sport Manitoba.

Scope and Application:

- 3. The policy applies to all coaches registered with; or named on an official sport roster; or under the jurisdiction of Triathlon Manitoba.
- 4. Any coach not having completed the RIS program or maintained certified status in the timeframe established by Sport Manitoba and Triathlon Manitoba may be removed as a coach until such time that the RIS course is completed and/or maintain RIS certification.

Enforcement:

Non-compliance of this policy may result in further discipline as determined by the Board of Directors or in accordance with Triathlon Manitoba policy.
